## *Product Emissions Standards Rules 2017*

### **Exemption Notice**

#### **Exemption No: ECP-22-0012E**

I, Tracy Gurnett, a Delegate of the Secretary of the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (the Department) grant this exemption from Part 3 of the Product Emissions Standards Act to Marine Power International LLC (ABN 25 003 100 007)

This exemption is granted under Section 32 of the Product Emissions Standards Rules 2017 in accordance with exemption category 30 (1)(c) for the import and supply of products for the use by the Australian Defence Force or a law enforcement or security agency for the emissions-controlled products specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice.

This exemption comes into force on the date that it is published on the Department's Website.

This exemption expires on the date specified in Condition 1 of Schedule 2.

In accordance with paragraph 32(1)(a) of the Rules, notice of this exemption will be published on the Department's website.

## Schedule 2

### Exemption Conditions

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In accordance with subsection 34(2) of the *Product Emissions Standards Rules 2017*, the exemption for the engines specified in Schedule 1 is granted subject to the following conditions:

1. The import, testing and evaluation of the ECP must be completed prior to the expiry date of **30 March 2025**.
2. The engines must only be supplied to the Australian Department of Defence for the purposes specified in the application.
3. The supply of the engines must only be undertaken after Marine Power International LLC has been provided with a purchase order or written request from the Australian Department of Defence.
4. The engines are to be labeled upon arrival with the relevant supply limitation details outlined in this Exemption Notice.
5. A copy of this exemption must be clearly displayed in the area(s) of the premises where the ECPs are stored.
6. The ECPs must be securely stored on Marine Power International LLC premises and marked in such a manner that they are clearly identifiable as ECPs imported under this exemption.
7. The engines must not be displayed by any person for sale in a retail showroom or sales area accessible to the public.
8. Exempted engines imported but not supplied by 30 November 2025 are not covered by this exemption.
9. Marine Power International LLC must submit a report demonstrating compliance with the conditions of this exemption, including documentation to confirm the number of engines imported and supplied prior to the expiry of the exemption. This report must be submitted to the Department by 25 March 2025 at the following email address:

10. This exemption is for a total of 200 ECPs as described in Schedule 1.
