## *Product Emissions Standards Rules 2017*

### **Exemption Notice**

#### **Exemption No: ECP-23-0002E**

I, Tracy Gurnett, a Delegate of the Secretary of the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (the Department) grant this exemption from Part 3 of the *Product Emissions Standards Act 2017* (the Act) for the import and supply of the emissions-controlled products specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice, for the purpose described in Schedule 2 to this Notice.

This exemption is granted under Section 32 of the Product Emissions Standards Rules 2017 in accordance with exemption category 30 (1)(d) for use by an emergency services organization of the emissions-controlled products specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice.

This exemption comes into force on the date that it is published on the Department's Website.

This exemption expires on the date specified in Condition 1 of Schedule 2.

In accordance with paragraph 32(1)(a) of the Rules, notice of this exemption will be published on the Department's website.

## Schedule 1

### Emissions-Controlled Products (ECPs) Included in this Exemption

## Schedule 2

### Exemption Conditions

---

In accordance with subsection 34(2) of the *Product Emissions Standards Rules 2017*, the exemption for the engines specified in Schedule 1 is granted subject to the following conditions:

1. The import, and supply of the ECPs in this exemption must be completed prior to the expiry date of **1 April 2025**.
2. The supply of engines must only be undertaken after Fire and Rescue NSW (FRNSW) have issued a purchase order or written request to a supplier capable of importing the engines specified in Schedule 1. The purchase order or written request must include information identifying FRNSW as the purchaser.
3. Consistent with the requirements of paragraph 34(1)(b) of the Rules, the engines must be accompanied throughout the supply chain within Australia by a copy of this exemption notice or by information regarding how the exemption can be accessed online.
4. When ordering these engines as described in Condition 2, FRNSW must provide the supplier (dealer) with a copy of the Exemption Notice to inform them of the supply limitation details, labelling requirements and other requirements of this Exemption as described in the Conditions in this Schedule, and to enable the Exemption number to be quoted by the importer on the import declaration.
5. The engines must not be displayed by any person for sale in a retail showroom or sales area accessible to the public.
6. Exempted engines imported but not supplied by 1 April 2025 are not covered by this exemption.
7. FRNSW must be able to submit a report relating to compliance with the conditions of this exemption, including documentation to confirm the name of the supplier (dealer), the model details and the number of engines imported and supplied prior to the expiry date of the exemption.
8. This exemption is for a total of 50 ECPs, with the total to be made up of any combination of the ECPs as described in Schedule 1.
