- All animals caught during this activity must be released into suitable habitat the same day as capture. However, if the animal is sick, injured or orphaned, it must be given to an appropriately licenced wildlife carer at the earliest possible time after capture.
- It is the responsibility of the permit holder to ensure all reasonable measures are put in place to minimise the likelihood of injury and/or death to protected wildlife.
