



Funding Acknowledgement

Australian Government funding of NESP projects must be acknowledged on all published materials that result from research activities.

Acknowledgement can be done in two ways, through due recognition words or using the Australian Government NESP logo.

Logo or due recognition words?

The size and style of a communication product will determine the most suitable way to acknowledge NESP funding. For example, a brochure or poster produced by a NESP project team would likely have the NESP hub logo as the main brand, and then have the option of including due recognition words or the Australian Government NESP logo as funding acknowledgement. The style and layout should guide the decision on which is most appropriate.

Due recognition words

Australian Government funding can be acknowledged in words as follows:

- The [name] hub is funded by the Australian Government's National Environmental Science Program.
- This project is supported with funding from the Australian Government's National Environmental Science Program.
- This project is jointly funded by [organisation/program name] and the Australian Government's National Environmental Science Program.

NESP logo



The National Environmental Science Program (NESP) logo is made up of the Australian Government crest and the NESP map graphic and text. ***It can only be used to show recognition of the Australian Government's support for a NESP hub or research project.***

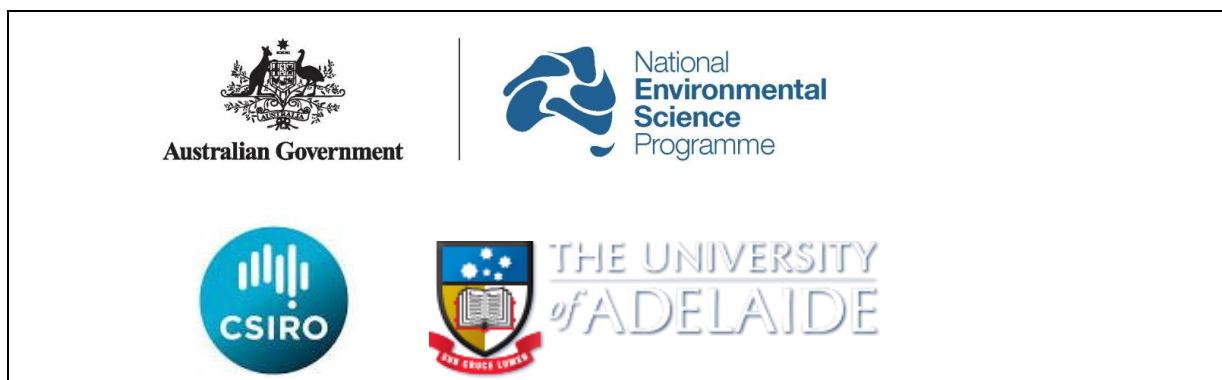
The NESP logo must not be used to give the impression the Australian Government has published a product or endorsed another organisation.

The Australian Government crest can only be applied to Australian Government departments and agencies or programs.

The NESP logo with other logos

Where a communication product contains the logos of a number of funding organisations, the Australian Government NESP logo should be used.

The hierarchy of logos where there are multiple funding sources or partners should reflect the level of contribution to the project or initiative, i.e. if the NESP is the main funder of a project, the NESP logo should be placed in the first and most prominent position on the communication product. For example



NESP words

Australian Government changes regarding the spelling of programme/program were made in 2017. In all materials produced after 2017, when writing the program name in full, please use National Environmental Science Program. Subsequent references are to “the program” (or NESP).

Logos and other branded materials which contain National Environmental Science Programme have been retained in order to minimise graphic design changes and associated costs.
