Accreditation of a Plan of Management for the Purposes of Part 13

I, PETER GARRETT, Minister for the Environment, Heritage and the Arts, being satisfied that:

- The management regime for the East Coast Inshore Fin Fish Fishery, as defined in the management regime in force under the Queensland *Fisheries Act 1994* and the Queensland Fisheries Regulation 2008, requires persons engaged in fishing under the management regime to take all reasonable steps to ensure that members of listed threatened species, listed migratory species, cetaceans and listed marine species are not killed or injured as a result of the fishing; and
- The fishery to which the management regime relates does not, or is not likely to, adversely affect:
 - the survival or recovery in nature of any listed threatened species; or
 - the conservation status of a listed migratory species, cetacean, or listed marine species or a population of that species,

hereby accredit the, the Queensland *Fisheries Act 1994* and the Queensland Fisheries Regulation 2008 to the extent that the Act and Regulations apply to the Queensland East Coast Inshore Fin Fish Fishery, pursuant to sections 208A, 222A, 245 and 265 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) for the purposes of Divisions 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Part 13 of the EPBC Act.
