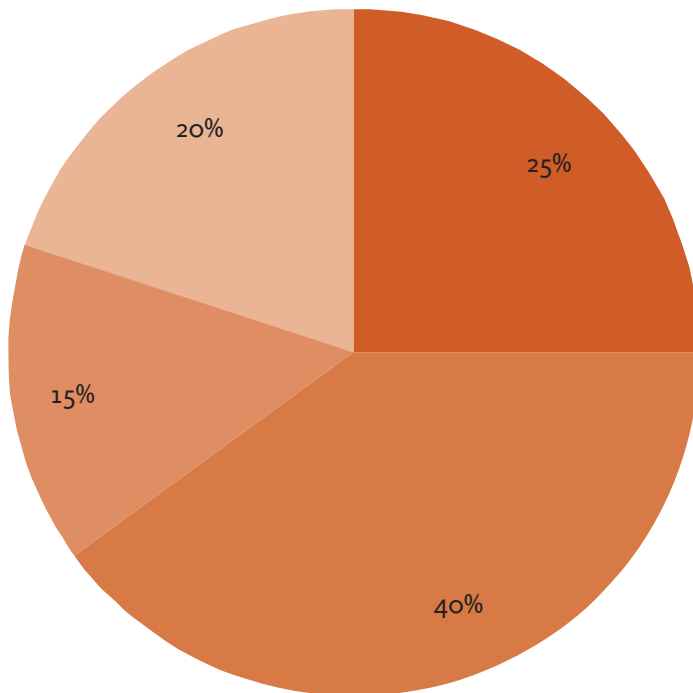


WHERE YOUR PARK FEES GO

100% of park pass revenue is invested directly back into the park.

This helps provide the visitor services and facilities you enjoy, preservation of the World Heritage environment and cultural sites, as well as payments to the traditional owners, supporting their homelands, training, and business development. The Uluru-Kata Tjuta park pass contributes 50% to the running of the park.



- **25% - Traditional owner lease payments**
 This money goes directly to the *Anangu* supporting their homelands, investments, training and business development
- **40% - Operations**
 Visitor site preparation, incident response, delivery of fire, feral and weed management, training and mentoring opportunities for local *Anangu* on country
- **15% - Ranger and cultural activities**
 Visitor centres, education, events, permits and park pass compliance
- **20% - Natural/cultural preservation**
 Rock art preservation, on country workshops, collection of aural histories, joint management, biodiversity management (threatened species, flora/fauna surveys)
